Ernest E. Geiswite, age 86, of North Ridgeville, passed away on October 13, 2013 at his home after a lengthy illness.

He was born on February 7, 1927 in Selinsgrove, PA and has lived in North Ridgeville for the past 50 years. He served in the United States Navy during World War II. He was a truck driver by trade, and was an owner/operator as well as driving for and retiring from Yellow Freight.

Ernest was a Charter Member of V.F.W. Post 9871 in North Ridgeville, the Loyal Order of Moose in Elyria and was a licensed pilot.

He enjoyed the outdoors, especially fishing, boating and in years past, hunting. When he wasn't cheering on his beloved Cleveland Indians, he could be found tending to his garden. He was a dog lover, and enjoyed all of his pets over the years. His greatest enjoyment was found in getting together with his family and barbecuing or hosting fish fries.

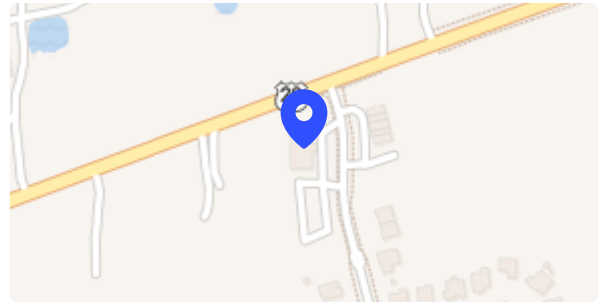

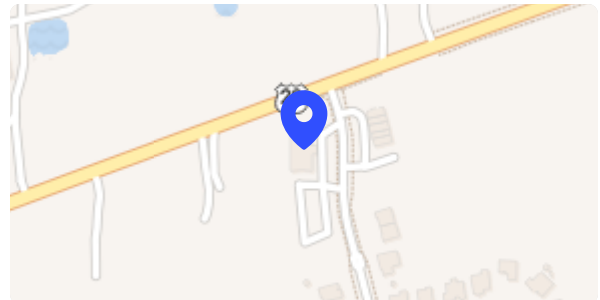
