K eith M. Butler, age 72, of Sheffield Village, passed away on Monday, February 24, 2014 at St. John Medical Center in Westlake after a brief illness. Keith was born on December 14, 1941 in Oakland, MD and has lived in Sheffield Village for the past 36 years, moving from Lakewood. He was United States Air Force Veteran and was a member of the American Legion. Keith worked at L.T.V. Steel in Cleveland, retiring in 1991.
