Donald G. Westenhofer, age 78, of North Ridgeville passed away Saturday February 6, 2021 at UH St. John Medical Center, Westlake.

Born in White Plains, NY he had resided in Brookfield, CT for over 40 years before moving to North Ridgeville, OH in 2006. He served in the US Marine Reserves. He was a certified Professional Engineer, specializing in sprinkler and fire protection until retiring in 2007.
