Jeanne M. Kovach, age 83, passed away on Thursday, July 21, 2022 at Westlake Village.

She was born in Canada and moved to Cleveland becoming an American citizen at the age of 9. She retired to Berea after working at the Cleveland Clinic as a Registered Nurse for 30 years.

Jeanne was a member of St. Julie Billiart Catholic Church in North Ridgeville and formerly St. Mary's in Berea where she served as the parish cook, sacristan and eucharistic minister. She was a member of Sisters of Notre Dame in the 1960's becoming an associate member in 2004.

She enjoyed cooking, reading and word search puzzles.

Survivors include her close friends and caregivers, Fr. George Vrabel of North Ridgeville and Suzanne Snyder of North Olmsted.

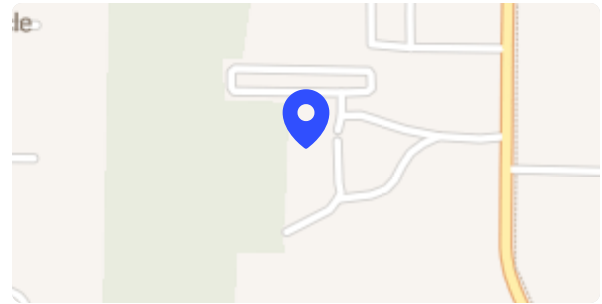

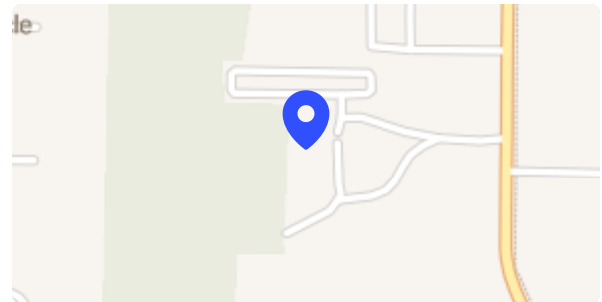

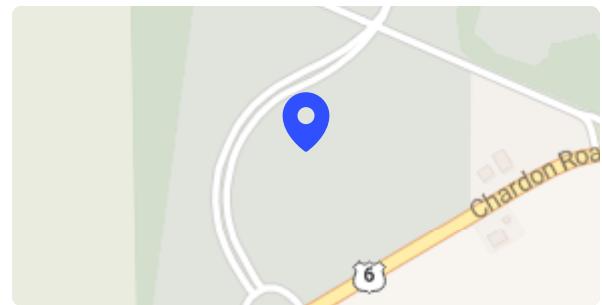
